Lesson Planning

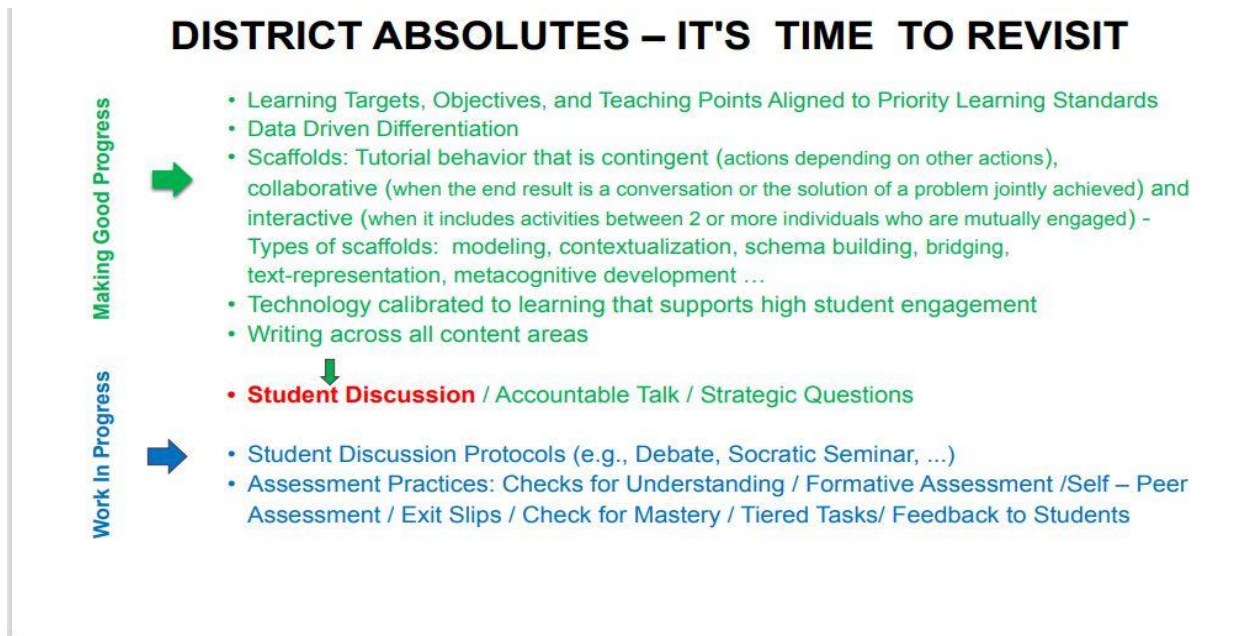
What Makes a Great Lesson Plan?
